CDC risk level reporting uses county specific data for the number of positive cases but reports hospitalizations based on health service areas. Dukes County is part of health service area 22 which also includes Nantucket, Barnstable, Middlesex, Norfolk, Suffolk and Plymouth Counties. Due to this reporting method Dukes County CDC classification may be different than the risk level calculated using local data only.
