





# 1914 W.B. Owen's Passing

Vineyard Haven as a public playground & recreation center**




# 1922, “The Playground” depicts 1st Band Stand in Owen Park



“the **bandstand** and the **seats** around were built by **volunteers** in the late afternoons and early evenings, the women of the town each night serving a free supper to the workers.


Through the same spirit of **generosity** the **entertainment** on the playground has also been provided, for the many people of note who visit the Vineyard are promptly pressed into service to give of their talent. **Band concerts** and **fireworks** vary the programs.

For the children there are **play swings** and **sand gardens** and a **baby group** in charge of a Red Cross Nurse holds say in the park each morning.”

# Added in Owen Park 20~30s

May 25, 1935



It was on a sunny afternoon, with the green sloping grounds of beautiful Owen Park on the Island of Vineyard Haven, Massachusetts, contrasting with the white sands of the beach and the blue waters of the harbor, when the lovely green bronze drinking fountain was presented by the local Woman's Christian Temperance Union to the town of Vineyard Haven.

After a program of songs and recitations by the school children under the direction of their teachers, the formal presentation was made by Mrs. Sydne Eldridge, as three little tots carefully drew aside the veil concealing the simple and graceful lines of the fountain. Mrs. Eldridge was a Crusader, the first president of the local union, and for many years county W.C.T.U. president.

Her picture, shown here at the fountain, will give pleasure to many friends outside the state as well as in all sections of Massachusetts, since this active worker has been prominent in most of the state conventions and was also house mother at the W.C.T.U. Home for Soldiers at Ayer, Massachusetts, throughout the World War. The latter position brought her in close and sympathetic relations with many women, mothers, wives and sweethearts of the soldiers, as well as with the men themselves.

Honor guest at the fountain presentation ceremony was Mrs. Alice G. Ropes, state W.C.T.U. president, who made a delightful talk to the children. Mrs. Ropes also was a guest of honor at the dinner and informal reception during the evening.
